Planned Parenthood, America's largest abortion provider wants to educate your kids about sex...

and your local school system has opened the door to them!

What kind of organization is Planned Parenthood?

- In 2009, the Tennessee legislature voted and defunded Planned Parenthood after witnessing a video filmed inside their Memphis clinic. The video showed clinic staff coaching a girl portraying a pregnant 14 year old on how to hide her pending abortion from her parents, and then encouraged her to protect her adult predator by lying to a judge. Clinic staff also failed to report the apparent sexual assault to law enforcement, as is required under Tennessee law. Similar investigations have produced similar results all across the nation.
- In 2009, Planned Parenthood concealed its plans to open a new Knoxville clinic by purchasing the property and by contracting services under an assumed identity. Similar incidents have occurred in Colorado, Washington, Ohio and Illinois.
- In 2009, Planned Parenthood abruptly blocked access to its Knoxville-based *FYI: Educating Peers About Sex* Facebook page when its obscene content was exposed to the public.
- When it was recently discovered that they had been given access to local schools, and attention was drawn to their TeenWire website, Planned Parenthood re-directed web traffic to a less offensive website.

So, what are they hiding?

You Got the Hook Up...

"Keep in mind that most people usually feel better about having sexual experiences when it's with someone they care about and trust. But hookups are common ways of exploring options.... Oh yeah, and a word about safety — random hookups may not be planned, but that doesn't mean you shouldn't come prepared!"

Guys Who Sleep With Guys...

We could not in good conscience print the excerpt from the article. It provides explicit descriptions of various sexual practices for young men who "sleep with guys". Covered topics include oral "rimming" of the anus and anal sex with a description of the lubricants that make it more comfortable.

Blasting Myths About Lesbians...

"For the record, sex doesn't have to include penile-vaginal intercourse to be "real." Real sex for lesbians, gays, bisexuals, or straight folks can include mutual masturbation, manual stimulation, rubbing or "dry humping," penetration with sex toys, or oral sex."

Is Phone Sex Normal?

"Phone sex is a kind of sex play that may involve masturbating to orgasm. Sex play is any voluntary sexual activity, with or without a partner. Sex play that does not involve intercourse is called outercourse....One advantage of phone sex and some other kinds of outercourse, such as cybersex — online sex, is that there is no risk of pregnancy or sexually transmitted infections."

Resolve to prepare!

"Anne (not her real name), 16, took Plan B after "fooling around" with her boyfriend led her to worry about whether she could get pregnant. Even though they didn't have penetrative sex, Anne wanted to make sure. "Because I knew Plan B was available, I worried less than I would have otherwise," she says."

Safer Sex 101...

"Abstinence — not having any sex play — is the only thing that is 100 percent effective against infection, but there are many types of sex play that are considered lower-risk activities. These include:

- manual stimulation — "hand jobs"
- mutual masturbation — phone sex, cybersex, watching each other
- oral sex
- vaginal intercourse with a latex or female condom
- anal intercourse with a latex or female condom"
